## Plan Overview Executive Summary

The 2023-2025 Northland Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) is built on data and insights gathered through a 2022 Community Health Assessment (CHA) conducted by the Northland Health Alliance (NHA). Analysis of CHA data led the NHA board of directors to select three priorities to be the focus of the Northland’s Community Health Improvement Plan: Improving Mental and Behavioral Health, Improving Access to Transportation, and Improving Access to Healthy Foods. The Mental/Behavioral Health and Access to Healthy Foods Priorities are carried over from the 2020-2022 CHIP to continue the work and progress being made in these areas.

NHA launched the Community Health Improvement planning process in June 2022 by convening more than 30 community stakeholders including representatives from local hospitals, nonprofit service organizations and public health departments. In keeping with practices established during COVID, participants were able to attend live or via Zoom. Members of NHA’s Data Task Force began the meeting with an overview of the data that led to the selection of the three CHIP Priorities. Following a Q&A, attendees were invited to move to one of three breakout rooms, organized around each of the Priorities, to begin work on writing the Priority statement, defining the Goals to pursue, and beginning initial conversation about potential measures for tracking progress/performance. Attendees in each breakout room were invited to sign up to participate in the Task Force for that Priority dedicated to CHIP plan development and implementation. All Task Force participants were asked to complete a commitment form, outlining anticipated time requirements and expectations for engagement

The three Priority Task Forces, supported by facilitators from iBossWell, Inc., met three to four times in July and August to build out the operational tactics to guide implementation of their section of the plan. The NHA board

reviewed a draft plan at their September meeting and committed to presenting the CHIP plan to the Northland community through two special events: one for community organizations held at NNI on October 21, and one for the general community held on November 3 at the Northland YMCA. Participants at both events received an overview of Community Health Assessment data, learned about the efforts NHA will undertake to address the three Priorities defined in the plan, and were invited to “sign up” to join a Task Force and/or to receive invitations to future updates about plan progress.

While the Priority Task Forces continued to meet to refine accountabilities in the plan (time frames for implementation, responsible parties) through November, work on the plan has already begun. The Task Forces will assess and report on plan progress twice a year to the NHA board of directors. NHA has also committed to sharing results via its website and through community briefings.
